

FROM THE PASTOR: Offer Them Christ

Offer them Christ. These were reportedly John Wesley's final words to Thomas Coke as Coke's boat departed from a pier in England for the long journey across the Atlantic to the American colonies. Toward the end of his life, Wesley had taken the bold step of commissioning Coke to go to America to ordain Francis Asbury and others into the ministry to support the Methodist movement there. These simple words summarized the crux of the vital work that Coke was being sent to do. Wesley plainly laid out the charge before Coke with these simple words. "Offer them Christ, Thomas."

Offer them Christ. I'm not exactly sure why, but I've heard this simple charge echoing in my head lately. Could it be the Holy Spirit whispering to me as an encouragement to give me a sense of purpose for the primary mission to which I am sent? Through the myriad council and committee meetings and navigating COVID protocols and Zoom meetings and finalizing details for Project Transformation this summer and so much other administrative business of the church, it all boils down to offering Christ to a hurting world. That is not just Wesley's charge, but that also sums up God's mission for the Church. We are to be people who offer Christ. Period. We offer Christ. and allow space for the Holy Spirit to

work from there.

Offer them Christ. Let these words be our commission as we begin an exciting summer filled with ministry to our community. Let's offer Christ as we welcome and nurture the 30-45 children and seven young adult interns from Project Transformation who will fill our building this summer starting June 7. Let's offer Christ as we offer children from our church and community an opportunity to wonder and be amazed at who God is at our VBS on June 13-16. Let's offer Christ as we keep feeding hungry people at our food pantry every Wednesday from 3-6 pm. Let's offer Christ as our senior group meets for their first in person SALT gathering since the pandemic on June 18. Let's offer Christ as we encounter those within our own church family who are struggling and need a little extra love and support. Let's offer Christ when we're on our own vacation journeys away from the church this summer. Let's keep this simple but profound charge to "offer them Christ" in view with everything we do, even and especially as our calendars fill up and task lists seem never-ending again. Offer them Christ, Smyrna First United Methodist Church! That's what it's all about.

IT'S OFFICIAL! Here are our revised COVID guidelines effective May 30th:

- Face coverings are no longer recommended for any event, ministry, or service at SFUMC that is either inside or outside. However, we offer the reminder that the CDC does still recommend unvaccinated people wear face coverings in public gathering.
- Face coverings for children are optional at parents' discretion, but we will require volunteers with children who are unvaccinated to wear face coverings.
- The ribbons that block off every other pew will remain in place to allow continued distancing in the Sanctuary.
- The offering stations will remain in the Sanctuary rather than going back to passing the plate for offering.
- Will also continue with attendance registration cards for now rather than passing attendance pads.
- Indoor food service will resume, but we will not have any self-serve buffet type lines.



A Letter to the Church from the Works in Progress Sunday School Class

Works in Progress (WIPS) has made the decision to attend Murfreesboro Pride on August 21 where we will show the love of God to all attendees. With the support of other Methodist churches in Rutherford County, we will be living out 1 John 4:7, "Let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God."

We understand the controversial aspect of this decision which was made prayerfully and with open hearts and minds. We recognize that the whole church is not of one mind regarding this issue and do not wish to cause division or schism within our beloved Smyrna First UMC family. Our goal is simply to show the love of Christ to a community of people who need to know the truth of God's love for them. In doing so, we affirm our current United Methodist polity that says *all individuals are of sacred worth and that God's grace is available to all.* We seek to spread this gospel message to a community of people who are commonly rejected and told they are unloved.

Through the next few weeks, many of us are willing to come discuss this topic and clarify our intentions with Sunday school classes or other groups or individuals at your request. We request these discussions center around Christian representation in the LGBT community, rather than theology or salvation of any individual. Our intention in attending Murfreesboro Pride is not to speak for others or the church as a whole, but instead to represent ourselves as a Sunday school class who seek in this specific way to offer hope and healing to a community desperately in need of it.




HELP NEEDED FOR WiFi UPGRADE
